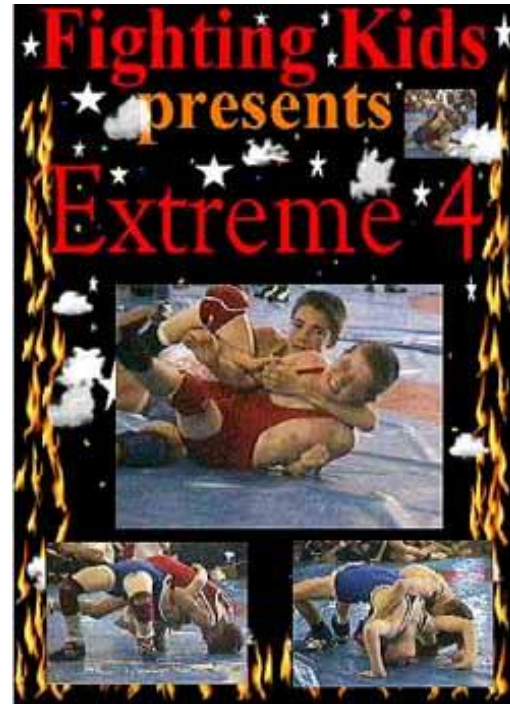

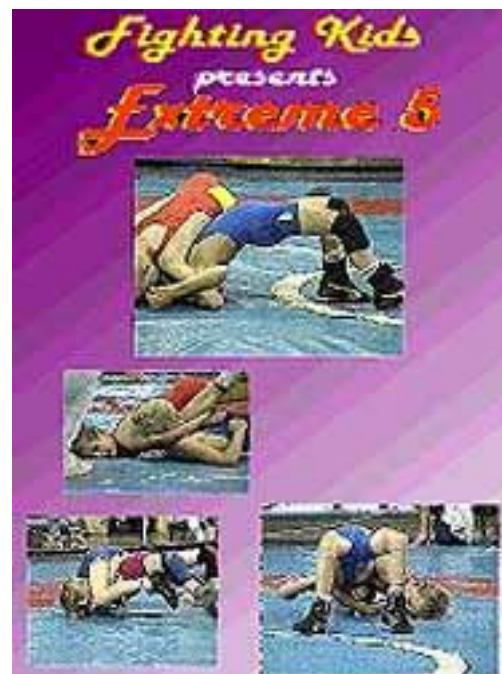

This unfeasibly long series of boy wrestling videos is by no means unique. The CVMC catalogue also has Russian boy swimming videos, American boy judo videos, and so forth, all innocuous in the Extreme (to coin a phrase), and all mysteriously pointless. I for one am quite content to see them on sale, and glad that the people at CVMC carry them in their huge and diverse stock of international titles, but they're all, in the final analysis, pretty desperate stuff.
